Years 1 and 2 have become scientists this week, finding out about the factors that influence ice melting! The children used wonderful language to explain their thoughts and knowledge. In Maths we have looked at grouping and in English we have been retelling the story of The Snail and the Whale. Year 1 have been adding detail to sentences from the book. Mrs Bromham has LOVED the words they have been using:

Artur talked of *"golden sands that felt like crumbly cookies"*,
Amalie talked of *"lava mountains that exploded"*,

COATS

Staff have all been surprised by the number of children still arriving to school with no coat, in this unpredictable and changing weather. Please send named coats in at all times!

CHICKEN POX

There has been a case of confirmed chicken pox in the school. Please inspect your child for spots and do not send them to school until all of the spots have scabbed over. Thank you

HEAD LICE

We have had a reported case of head lice in school, please check your children's hair regularly.

Wet combing

Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing. You should try this method first.

You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits.

There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you:

- wash hair with ordinary shampoo
- apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)
- comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends

It usually takes about 10 minutes to comb short hair, and 20 to 30 minutes for long, frizzy or curly hair.

Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17.

Re: E-Consenting for your child's flu vaccination

We are writing to inform you that the Immunisation Team will be moving to e-consenting for our school based immunisation programme from the start of the 2019/2020 academic year.

Using e-consent is quicker and easier for you and can be completed on any platform i.e. mobile phone, tablet or computer. However in the event that this is not possible, please contact the immunisation team.

Your child is due to receive the Flu vaccination on **Monday 18th November 2019**. You can find out further information about this vaccine in this leaflet and at the following links:

Please complete the e-consent form by **Monday 11th November 2019**.

Please ensure that you complete and submit your child's consent form promptly, whether you wish your child to be immunised or not. Parents who have not submitted their consent form by the deadline and wish their child to be immunised will need to call the immunisation team to book an appointment at a community catch up clinic.
